What is Time for Twos?


Some two year old children may be able to get up to 15 hours of free childcare. This is known as **Time for Twos** in Dudley.

You can apply for a Time for Twos place for your child as soon as they have had their second birthday.

The free childcare place runs for three terms until your child moves in to their free early education place the term after their third birthday.

This is something we offer in our dedicated Time for Twos room at **Jesson's CE Primary School (VA)** in the heart of Dudley.

What do we mean by "flexible 15 hours"?

You can spread the 15 hours provision across the week (in 3 hour blocks) in any way you like. For example:-

- You could have 3 hours each morning for 5 days.
- You could have 6 hours for 2 days and then 3 hours on another day.

The hours would need to booked in advance.

We will work with you to find the best options for your family circumstances.

What we can offer

From 19th February 2024:-

- 15 hours per week (FREE) for 2-yearolds families receiving government support.

From September 2025:-

- Available for the term after your child is 2 years old.
- 30 hours per week (FREE) for 2-yearolds of **working parents.**
- 15 hours per week (FREE) for 2-yearolds of **families receiving government support.**
- Additional hours are available for a charge, up to 30 hours maximum in a week.
- 38 weeks per year during term time.
