**Additions/changes to Child Behaviour Policy for re-opening of Schools from June 2020**

## Additions to Child Behaviour Policy:

- If you choose to send your child to school, we will expect them in everyday they are allocated and all day unless they are ill or the family need to self-isolate;
- School uniform is not expected, allowing clothes to be washed more frequently;
- When working indoors, windows will be opened to ventilate classrooms and doors left open to eliminate touching of handles
- The outside environment will be utilised as much as possible as guidance has indicated that this reduces the risk of infection
- Only one parent is allowed on site for pick up/drop off, and parents on site need to observe social distancing;
- Pick up and drop off routines must be strictly adhered to including the gate and door you must use (this will be clearly signposted);

## School timings:

### Year 6

- Year group will attend Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (this may need to be amended if pupil numbers increase)
- Children will be in classes of 6 children with desks socially distanced.
- Each group of 6 will wear a coloured wrist band, so the children know the group they are in.

### Start/Finish times

- Two groups will start at 9.00am and finish at 2.45pm (blue and green)
- Two groups will start at 9.15am and finish at 3.00pm (orange and yellow)
- Three groups will start at 9.30am and finish at 3.15pm (white, red and silver)

### Playtimes

- 2 groups will go out at 10.30 -10.40 (blue and green)
  - 2 groups will go out at 10.40-10.50 (orange and yellow)
  - 3 groups will go out at 10.50 to 11.00 (white, red and silver)

  - Blue/green – 12.00
  - Orange/Yellow – 12.10
  - White/Red/silver 12.20

## **Reception**

## **Year 1**

- Year group will attend Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (this may need to be amended if pupil numbers increase)

### **Start/Finish times**

- Two groups will start at 9.00am and finish at 2.45pm (blue and green)
- Two groups will start at 9.15am and finish at 3.00pm (orange and yellow)

### **Playtimes**

- 2 groups will go out at 10.30 -10.40 (blue and green)

- Blue/green – 12.00

## **Children's rules whilst in school**

- Children are to avoid contact with children from other groups, to reduce the chance of infection (this includes at break time and lunch time).
- Children will have a tray on their allocated table with their books in and a reading book.
- Children will be given a clear pencil case with their name on which also must remain on their desk.
- Children must not take any books or equipment from another child's table or tray.
- They must stay on their allocated table whilst they are in school for the three days and cannot leave their chair or the classroom unless permitted by the teacher.
- In terms of marking, live marking will be incorporated into the lesson, as no books will be allowed to be taken home by staff.
- Children will be given a new exercise book/books and they can then stay in their tray.
- At the end of three days the reading books will go in a COVID 19 box and not used until the next week.
- If children bring a coat they are to go on the back of their chair.
- Children will be given a work pack at the end of their three days for the rest of the week.
- Children are not to use the cloakrooms as they are not allowed to congregate in the corridor.
- Children must stay in their groups at all times.
- When passing in corridors children will keep to their left and should walk past other children without delay.
- There should be no groups of children in the corridor at any time and social distancing will be maintained when walking through the corridors with their group.
- Children will be expected to follow the "Catch it, bin it, kill it" routine whilst in school and any dirty tissues will be placed in the pedal bins provided. (The school will ensure these bins are emptied and cleaned regularly).
- Children must wash their hands on a regular basis and when instructed by the class teacher. If children sneeze, they should then wash their hands and dispose of the paper towels in the bins provided.
- Children only allowed to go to the toilet one at a time and will have a designated toilet block to use. Due to the number of groups it will not be possible to have a toilet block each. If a child from another group is in the toilets the other child will need to wait until the toilets are empty.
- Sanctions specific to Corona virus will be put into place and communicated to the children.
- Children who fail to follow the rules and as a result could put other children or staff at risk will be removed from their classroom and parents will be contacted to collect them from school (this could include things like coughing or sneezing towards someone else on purpose, spitting, leaving the classroom without permission etc.).
- If a child feels they are suffering with symptoms of COVID 19 (temperature, cough, loss of taste or smell) they must tell a member of staff immediately. They will be taken to a safe location and monitored until they can be collected by parents/carers.

## Drop-off/Collection rules

- Social distancing is key to reducing the chance of infection and in school things have been put in place to facilitate it. When dropping children off at school there are markings on the playground that should be used to maintain the 2m spacing.
- Start and finish times have been staggered, so parents must ensure they drop children off and pick them up at the correct time.
- Parents should leave the playground by the allocated gate as quickly as possible and avoid congregating around the gates, which will prevent other parents from maintaining the 2m spacing.
- Only one parent/carer is allowed onto the playground to drop off or pick up a child.
- Parents will be asked to stand 2m back from the allocated door and send their children into school;
- Children will be directed to wash their hands regularly and encouraged not to touch their face;
- Breakfast club and after school club will not open until further notice.
- There will be no after school clubs until further notice;
- The normal curriculum will not be able to happen due to restrictions around resources and the use of space in school;
- Books and other resources will not be sent home and brought back into school
- There will be an increase in cleaning schedules across school;
- There will be no face-to-face meetings with staff whilst restrictions last;
- Queries to the school office should be by telephone or email;
- The school will not permit visitors to access the school building other than in exceptional circumstances e.g. a social worker visiting a child who is at risk;
- Children will have the option of a hot meal if pre-ordered with the office, if not a packed lunch will need to be sent in.
- Free School Meal vouchers will continue for those receiving them at present and these children will need to bring a packed lunch;
- If a child becomes ill they will be isolated in another room until their parents collect them, (please ensure we have up-to-date contact details)
- If called by school to inform you that your child is ill, you must attend school as quickly as possible to take your child home.
